5. Light showers during the forenoon, Light rain all afternoon.

Amount of rainfall during the month, .86 inch.

Observations taken each morning at 7 o'clock.

During the month there were only three mornings which were cloudy, and four partly cloudy, all the others being clear, and most of these clear after the early morning.

It will be observed that the average temperature has been much higher than the average for the corresponding month during the last eighteen years, whilst the amount of rainfall is the lowest, except during the drought of two years ago.
