Colder Weather Than Usual for This Month—Rainfall Nearly 3 Inches.

During the month there were fifteen clear mornings, ten cloudy, and five partly cloudy at the time of observation, which is 7 A. M. each day. The weather has been unusually mild, until the past week, which has been quite cold for the season.

There was a distinct earthquake shock at 3:10 P. M. on the 25th.
