



With 2 days having past since the storms of Sunday night and early Monday morning, more tornadoes have been confirmed than it seemed there had been at first. There were not any in Maryland west of the Chesapeake or in Virginia despite a lot of tornado warnings. Circulations detected on radar a few thousand feet off the ground did not make it to the ground in these areas. Sometimes atmospheric conditions are not favorable for that to happen. It's possible more reports will be forthcoming. In other states, there were 7 tornadoes in Pennsylvania including an EF2 in Warren County. An EF2 in Sussex County Delaware near Bethel caused an injury. A possible tornado 10 northwest of the Delaware tornado touched down in Maryland north of El Dorado in Dorchester County. Elsewhere there were 3 confirmed tornadoes in Ohio and one possible tornado. There were 2 tornadoes each in Alabama and Georgia. And finally one tornado in North Carolina near Medoc Mountain State Park was 20 miles southwest of Roanoke Rapids and 50 miles northeast of Raleigh. Below is plot of the storm reports. Blue marks are severe wind gusts or wind damage, green is hail and red marks are the tornadoes.
